I offer you this spiritual "Bouquet of Roses" because I love you. I put all my confidence in you, since your prayers before God are most powerful. For the greater glory of God and for the sake of Jesus, your loving Son, hear and grant my prayer. Sweet Heart of Mary, be my salvation.

### PRAYING THE HOLY ROSARY

On the Crucifix: Apostles' Creed Our Father

3 Hail Mary's (For the virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity)

Glory Be

On the Our Father bead, announce the Mystery and say the Prayer for that particular Mystery followed by the Our Father.



10 Hail Mary's (1 on each bead)

At the end of each Decade, say the Glory Be and the Fatima Prayer

Repeat until all 5 decades of the mystery have been said. Then say the closing prayers below.

#### "Hail Holy Queen" (SALVE REGINA):

Hail, holy Queen, mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. #### Closing Prayer:



#### After five decades, conclude by saying three times:

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

#### Optional concluding prayer

Eternal God, in Whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Thy mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Thy holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself. Amen.

## Novena Intentions (say the chaplet for)

First Day - all mankind, especially all sinners.

Second Day - the souls of priests and religious.

Third Day - all devout and faithful souls.

**Fourth Day** - those who do not believe in God and who do not yet know Christ.

Fifth Day - the souls who have separated themselves from the Church. (Jesus's original words here were "heretics and schismatics," since he spoke to Saint Faustina within the context of her times. As of the Second Vatican Council, Church authorities have seen fit not to use those designations in accordance with the explanation given in the Council's Decree on Ecumenism (n.3). Every pope since the Council has reaffirmed that usage.)



Station 2: Jesus is made to bear His Cross.

O Jesus, You chose to die for me. Help me to love You always with all my heart.

Station 3: Jesus Falls the First Time.

O Jesus, make me strong to conquer my wicked passions, and to rise quickly from sin.

Station 4: Jesus is met by His Blessed Mother.

O Jesus, grant me a tender love for Your Mother, who offered Your for love or me.

Station 5: Jesus is helped by Simon of Cyrene.

O Jesus, like Simon, lead me ever closer to You through my daily crosses and trials

Station 6: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.

O Jesus, imprint Your image on my heart that I may be faithful to You all my life

Station 7: Jesus falls the second time.

O Jesus, I repent for having offended You. Grant me forgiveness of all my sins.

Station 8: Jesus speaks to the women of Jerusalem.

O Jesus, grant me tears of compassion for Your sufferings and of sorrow for my sins.

Station 9: Jesus falls the third time.

# 7 Joys of Mary/Franciscan Crown

HISTORY: The Franciscan Crown (or Seraphic Rosary) is a rosary consisting of seven decades in commemoration of the Seven Joys of the Virgin. The use of this rosary was begun in the Order of St. Francis in 1422. The Franciscan Rosary of the Seven Joys of the Blessed Virgin Mary is composed of seven decades of 1 Our Father and 10 Hail Marys each.



**BEADS:** Like the Holy Rosary, the Seven Joys is a "bead-prayer."

Franciscan Crown beads are designed to keep count of the prayers. They are not required to perform the devotion, however. There are 76 beads in the circlet, which is connected to a medal, plus a pendant string of five more beads, ending with a crucifix and a second medal depicting St. Francis of Assisi. The circlet contains seven sets of ten "Hail Mary" beads, and one "Our Father" bead between each set--with one exception. The Our Father bead for the First Joy is located on the pendant string, closest to the connecting medal.

PRAYERS: Pray one "Our Father" and ten "Hail Marys" for each of the Seven Joys. The final prayers are: two more "Hail Marys", making a total of 72; then one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the intentions of the Pope. The number "72" is significant. It honors the tradition that Mary's earthly life lasted 72 years. Devotional manuals sometimes add other prayers, but these are optional.

To pray the Seven Joys using beads: Start with the Our Father bead closest to the connecting medal. Follow the beads around the circlet until you return to the connecting medal. Then, continuing with the pendant string, skip the first bead (which you already used to start the devotion), and pray the final four prayers on the four remaining beads. This will bring you to the crucifix.

Sign of the Cross: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

**After each mystery**, pray one Our Father and ten Hail Marys

- **1. The Annunciation of the angel Gabriel of Mary**. (Luke 1: 26-33; 38)
- 2. The Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. (Luke 1:39-45)
- 3. The Nativity of our Lord Jesus. (Luke 2:1-7 or 2:6-12)
- **4. The Adoration of the Magi/Epiphany**. (Matthew 2:1-2 & 9-11)

- 5. The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. (Luke 2:22-23 & 25-32)
- **6. The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus**. (Mark 16:1-7, Luke 24:36-41, John 20:19-22)
- **7. The Assumption & Coronation of Mary** {Luke 1:46-55, Psalm 45 (44):11-14, Rev.12:1;5-6}

It is customary, after the seventh mystery, to pray two Hail Marys to bring the total number to 72 in honor of the tradition that the Virgin lived for 72 years on earth.

**Prayer for the Pope:** 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, and 1 Glory Be for the intentions of the Pope.

The rosary beads are grouped into seven beads of seven with a total of forty nine beads with three additional beads and a Crucifix. Each group of seven begins with One Our Father, and seven Hail Mary, where we honor and learn to imitate the life of our Lady and her virtues.



The Sign of the Cross: In the name of the Father of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

#### Three Hail Marys

(in remembrance of the tears that our Mother shed because of the suffering of her Divine Son and plead for repentance for the sins committed.)

#### An Act of Contrition

O Lord, Jesus Christ, I am truly sorry for my sins. I humbly ask Your forgiveness, and I promise with Your help to prove worthy of Your love by sharing in Your Passion and death through Our Blessed Mother's sorrows. Amen.

**After each mystery**, pray one Our Father and ten Hail Marys

- 1. The Prophecy of Simeon over the Infant Jesus. (Luke 2:34)
- 2. The Flight into Egypt of the Holy Family. (Matthew 2:13)
- 3. The Loss of the Child Jesus for Three Days. (Luke 2:43)
- **4. The Meeting of Jesus and Mary along the Way of the Cross**. (Luke 23:26)
- 5. The Crucifixion, where Mary stands at the foot of the cross. (John 19:25)
- 6. The Descent from the Cross, where Mary receives the dead body of Jesus in her arms. (Matthew 27:57)
- 7. The Burial of Jesus. (John 19:40)

#### Concluding prayers

Pray for us, O most sorrowful Virgin.

That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

# **Rosary of the Holy Wounds**

This devotion to the Holy Wounds was revealed by Our Lord to Sr. Mary Martha Chambon (1841-1907), of the Monastery of the Visitation of Chambery. The Rosary of the Holy Wounds consists of three prayers that are said on specific portions of regular rosary beads as follows:



**Step 1** - The following prayers are said on the crucifix and first four beads:

O JESUS, Divine Redeemer, be merciful to us and to the whole world. Amen.

Strong God, Holy God, Immortal God, have mercy on us and on the whole world. Amen

Grace and Mercy, O my Jesus, during present dangers; cover us with Your Precious Blood. Amen.

ETERNAL Father, grant us mercy through the Blood of Jesus Christ, Your only Son; grant us mercy we beseech You. Amen, Amen, Amen.

**Step 2** - The following prayer is said on the Our Father beads of the rosary chain:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Wounds of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, to heal the wounds of our souls.

**Step 3** - The following prayer is said on the small beads of the rosary chain:

My Jesus, pardon and mercy, through the merits of Your Holy Wounds.

# **Chaplet of the Five Wounds**

The Chaplet of the Five Wounds was first approved by a Decree of Pope Pius VII, dated January 22, 1822. According to this earliest form, the Beads consisted of five sections with each section consisting of five beads, on each of which was said an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory be to the Father. Between each of the five sections, one Hail Mary was said in honor of Our Lady of Sorrows.

#### On the Medal:

V. Incline to my aid, O God.

R. O Lord, make haste to help me.

V. Glory be...

R. As it was...

#### First Wound - The Left Foot:

Glory be to the Father on each bead Hail Mary

#### Second Wound - The Right Foot:

My crucified Jesus, I devoutly adore the painful wound of Your right foot. Ah, by the pain which You did feel therein, and by the blood which You did shed from that foot, grant me grace to walk constantly in the way of Christian virtue, even to the entrance of paradise.

#### Third Wound - The Left Hand:

My crucified Jesus, I devoutly adore the painful wound of Your left hand. Ah, by the pain which You did feel therein, and by the blood which You did shed from that hand, deliver me from being found at Thy left hand with the reprobate at the last judgment.

#### Fourth Wound - The Right Hand:

My crucified Jesus, I devoutly adore the painful wound of Your right hand. Ah, by the pain which You did feel therein, and by the blood which You did shed from that hand, bless my soul and conduct it to Thy kingdom.

#### Fifth Wound - The Side:

My crucified Jesus, I devoutly adore the painful wound of Your sacred side. Ah, by the pain which You did shed from it, enkindle in my heart the fire of Your love, and give me grace to persevere in loving Thee to all eternity.

#### **Concluding Prayer:**



**Step 8:** On the chain link pray The Decade Prayer: Oh my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to Heaven, and help especially those most in need of Thy Mercy.

Step 9: On the clasp pray The Angel's Prayer:

Oh Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly. I offer You the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences by which He is offended. By the infinite merits of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg the conversion of poor sinners. Amen.

# **Chaplet of the Immaculate Heart of Mary**

Said with an ordinary rosary

The Sign of the Cross is made five times in veneration of the Savior's five Holy Wounds.

On the large beads say: Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary, Pray for those who seek refuge in you.

**Concluding Prayer:** Say the Glory Be 3 times.





- 7. St. Anthony, guide of travelers, bring to safe harbor those who are in danger of perishing and calm the troubled waves of passion which agitate our souls.

## **Medal of St Benedict**





On the face of the medal is the image of Saint Benedict. In his right hand he holds the cross, the Christian's symbol of salvation. The cross reminds us of the zealous work of evangelizing and civilizing England and Europe carried out mainly by the Benedictine monks and nuns, especially for the sixth to the ninth/tenth centuries.

In St. Benedict's left hand is his Rule for Monasteries that could well be summed up in the words of the Prolog exhorting us to "walk in God's ways, with the Gospel as our guide."

On a pedestal to the right of St. Benedict is the poisoned cup, shattered when he made the sign of the cross over it. On a pedestal to the left is a raven about to carry away a loaf of poisoned bread that a jealous enemy had sent to St. Benedict.

Above the cup and the raven are the Latin words: Crux s. patris Benedicti (The Cross of our holy father Benedict). On the margin of the medal, encircling the figure of Benedict, are the Latin words:

Eius in obitu nostro praesentia muniamur!

May we be strengthened by his presence in the hour of our death!

Benedictines have always regarded St. Benedict as a special patron of a happy death. He himself died in the chapel at Montecassino while standing with his arms raised up to heaven, supported by the brothers of the monastery, shortly after St. Benedict had received Holy Communion

Below Benedict we read: ex SM Casino MDCCCLXXX (from holy Monte Cassino, 1880). This is the medal struck to commemorate the 1400th anniversary of the birth of Saint Benedict.

#### Reverse Side of the Medal

Crux mihi lux

On the back of the medal, the cross is dominant. On the arms of the cross are the initial letters of a rhythmic Latin prayer:

Crux sacra sit mihi lux! Nunquam draco sit mihi dux!

May the holy cross be my light! May the dragon

never be my guide!.

In the angles of the cross, the letters C S P B stand for Crux Sancti Patris Benedicti (The cross of our holy father Benedict).

Above the cross is the word pax (peace), that has been a Benedictine motto for centuries. Around the margin of the back of the medal, the letters V R S N S M V - S M Q L I V B are the initial letters, as mentioned above, of a Latin prayer of exorcism against Satan:

Vade retro Satana! Nunquam suade mihi vana! Sunt mala quae libas. Ipse venena bibas!

Begone Satan! Never tempt me with your vanities! What you offer me is evil. Drink the poison yourself!

#### Use of the Medal

There is no special way prescribed for carrying or wearing the Medal of St. Benedict. It can be worn on a chain around the neck, attached to one's rosary, kept in one's pocket or purse, or placed in one's car or home. The medal is often put into the foundations of houses and building, on the walls of barns and sheds, or in one's place of business.

The purpose of using the medal in any of the above ways is to call down God's blessing and protection upon us, wherever we are, and upon our homes and possessions, especially through the intercession of St. Benedict. By the conscious and devout use of the medal, it becomes, as it were, a constant silent prayer and reminder to us of our dignity as followers of Christ.

The medal is a prayer of exorcism against Satan, a prayer for strength in time of temptation, a prayer for peace among ourselves and among the nations of the world, a prayer that the Cross of Christ be our light and guide, a prayer of firm rejection of all that is evil, a prayer of petition that we may with Christian courage "walk in God's ways, with the Gospel as our guide," as St. Benedict urges us.

The Medal of St. Benedict can serve as a constant reminder of the need for us to take up our cross daily and "follow the true King, Christ our Lord," and thus learn "to share in his heavenly kingdom," as St. Benedict urges us in the Prolog of his Rule.

# Chaplet of the St Kateri Tekakwitha

(Also known as: the Kateri Indian Rosary)

This Chaplet has 24 beads, representing one year of Blessed Kateri's holy life. There are 8 brown beads (the color of the earth), 8 red beads (the color of blood), and 8 crystal beads (clear like water).



On each brown bead, say the "Our Father". On each red bead, say the "Hail Mary". On each crystal bead, say the "Glory be".

# **Novena Prayer to St Kateri**

Kateri, favored child and Lily of the Mohawks, I come to seek your intercession in my present need: (here mention it).

I admire the virtues which adorned your soul: love of God and neighbor, humility, obedience, patience, purity and the spirit of sacrifice. Help me to imitate your example in my state of life. Through the goodness and mercy of God, Who has blessed you with so many graces which led you to the true faith and to a high degree of holiness, pray to God for me and help me.

Obtain for me a very fervent devotion to the Holy Eucharist so that I may love Holy Mass as you did and receive Holy Communion as often as I can. Teach me also to be devoted to my crucified Savior as you were, that I may cheerfully bear my daily crosses for love of Him Who suffered so much for love of me. Most of all I beg you to pray for me that I may avoid sin, lead a holy life and save my soul. AMEN

In Thanksgiving to God for the graces bestowed upon Kateri:

One Our Father, One Hail Mary, Three Glory Be's Kateri, Lily of the Mohawks, pray for me.
